### 326 Crime Prevention Operations

### Tshwane Metro Police Department arrested 25 illegal immigrants during sting operations

The Tshwane Metro Police Department (TMPD) officers, in collaboration with other law enforcement agencies, conducted sting operations in two separate locations in Tshwane, aimed at enforcing immigration laws. These successful operations are an ongoing effort in Tshwane, to enforce the law and apprehend law offenders that are perpetuating these crimes.

On 7 October 2025, TMPD Region 6 officers, together with other law enforcement agencies, conducted Operation Tshwara Motho in Nellmapius, Pretoria East. During the operation, 12 illegal immigrants were arrested for being in the country without the required documentation. This lawless behaviour was met with the full force of the law, as firm enforcement is necessary against those who contravene the laws of the country.

A second integrated operation, involving various stakeholders, was conducted by Region 7 members in the Bronkhorstspruit and Ezithobeni areas. An additional 13 illegal immigrants were arrested for contravening the Immigration Act, 2002 (Act 13 of 2002). These successful operations reflect the TMPD's commitment to establishing a strong presence in protecting Tshwane residents from illegal activities. All the arrested suspects were detained at local police stations.

TMPD is committed to maintaining law and order, ensuring public safety and promoting compliance with local regulations. Well done to all officers involved.





# Highlights: Tshwane IGR operation: August 2025: Soshanguve



- 393 suspects traced and arrested



- 7. Enforcing ALL By Laws: to prevent urban decay and also concentrate on Land Invasion and Problem/Bad Buildings.
- 8. Roadsafety: Driver & Vehicle Fitness, Speeding, Drunk Driving, Overloading of passengers for reward and Pedestrian Safety. Events management: the Safety and Security at events
- 9. Visibility at Places of Entertainment, Economic Hubs, Shopping Malls & Tourist attractions
- 10. Be vigilant for Extortions & Kidnappings by looking out for hijacked vehicles, stolen vehicles, vehicles without number plates, Reckless & Negligent driving and ensure the proper searching of vehicles
